### Why do birds matter?

We will investigate how birds:

- contribute to the diversity of plant life through pollination and seed dispersal;
- control insect outbreaks and create important nesting areas for other species;
- help rid the world of disease through scavenger "clean-up" services, like carrion crows and magpies.

## Why do we need to create a "picture" of how birds are doing across the UK?

Our data will help create a snapshot of how birds are doing around the UK. If we find that birds are struggling, this is an indicator that other animals and wildlife may be in trouble too. We will investigate how birds play an important part in the ecosystem and food chain.

### **Art and Design**

Children will improve their mastery of art techniques such as drawing and painting.

Using their sketch books to develop their skills they will learn how to draw a bird, paying attention to its features, scale and size.

Once the children have mastered how to successfully sketch their bird they will have a go at adding colour using watercolour paints.

#### PE - Dance

Children to perform dances using a range of movement patterns in the context of choreographing dances inspired by the Carnival of the Animals by Camille Saint-Saëns.
