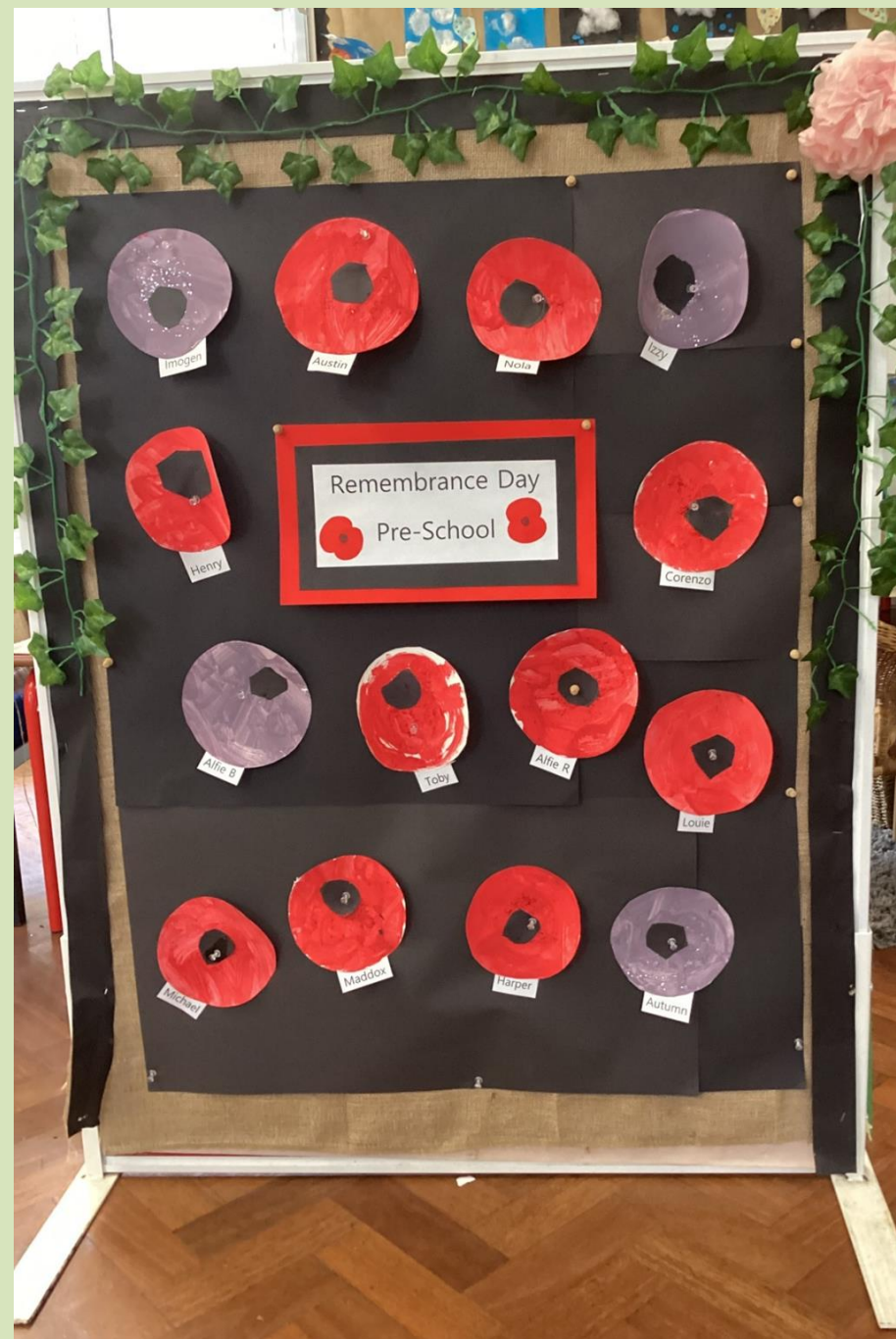


Remembrance Exhibition November 2023



The children of Stanbridge Lower School are delighted to share their Remembrance exhibition with you. We will remember them and also those who have continued to make sacrifices more recently.

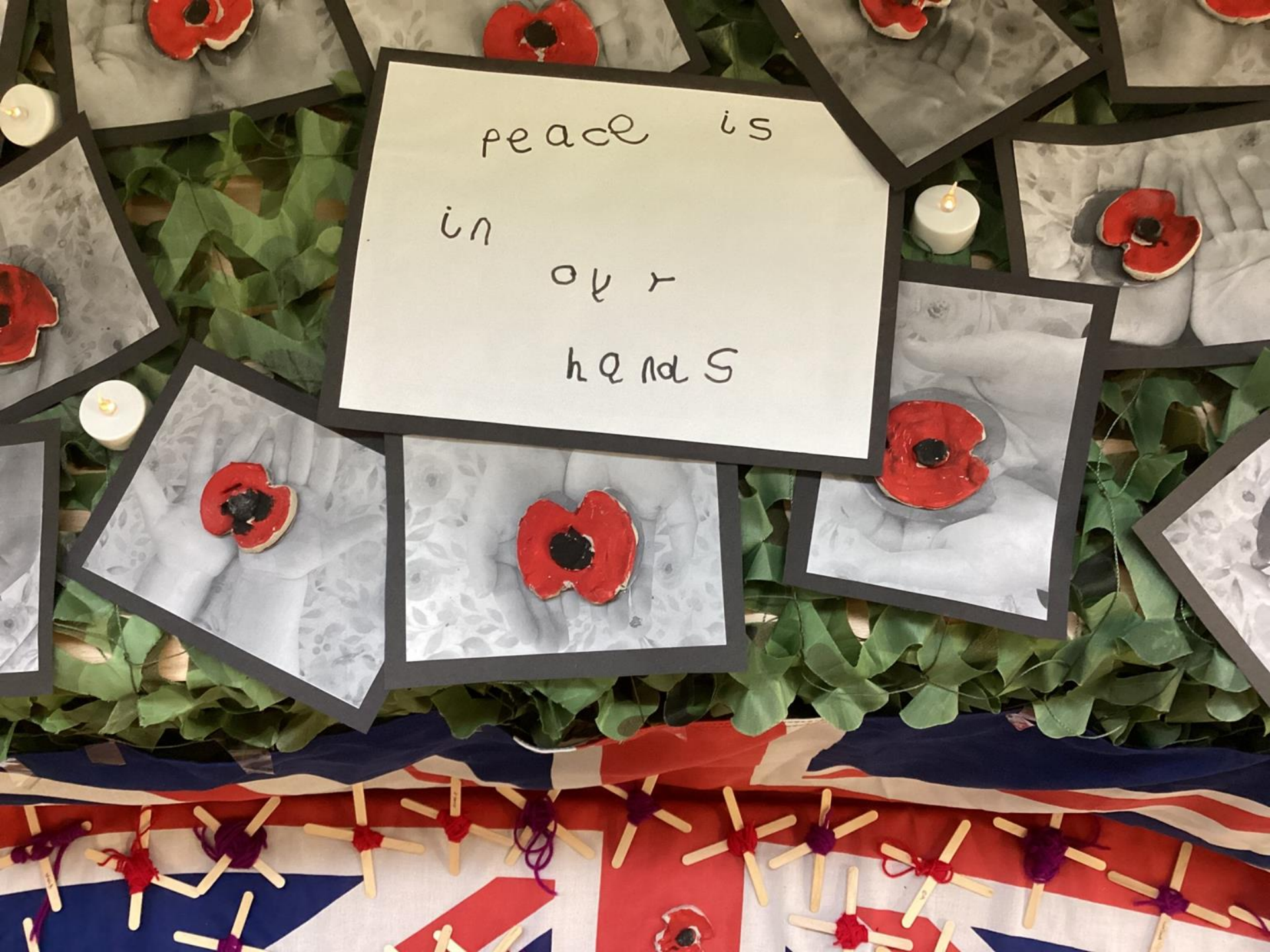

In the boxes below, write down everything that you know and have found out about First World War planes. How were they used? What impact on the war did they have? How are they different from modern planes?



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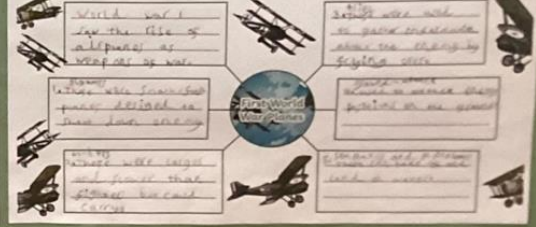

Military dogs and their jobs in WW1 and WW2

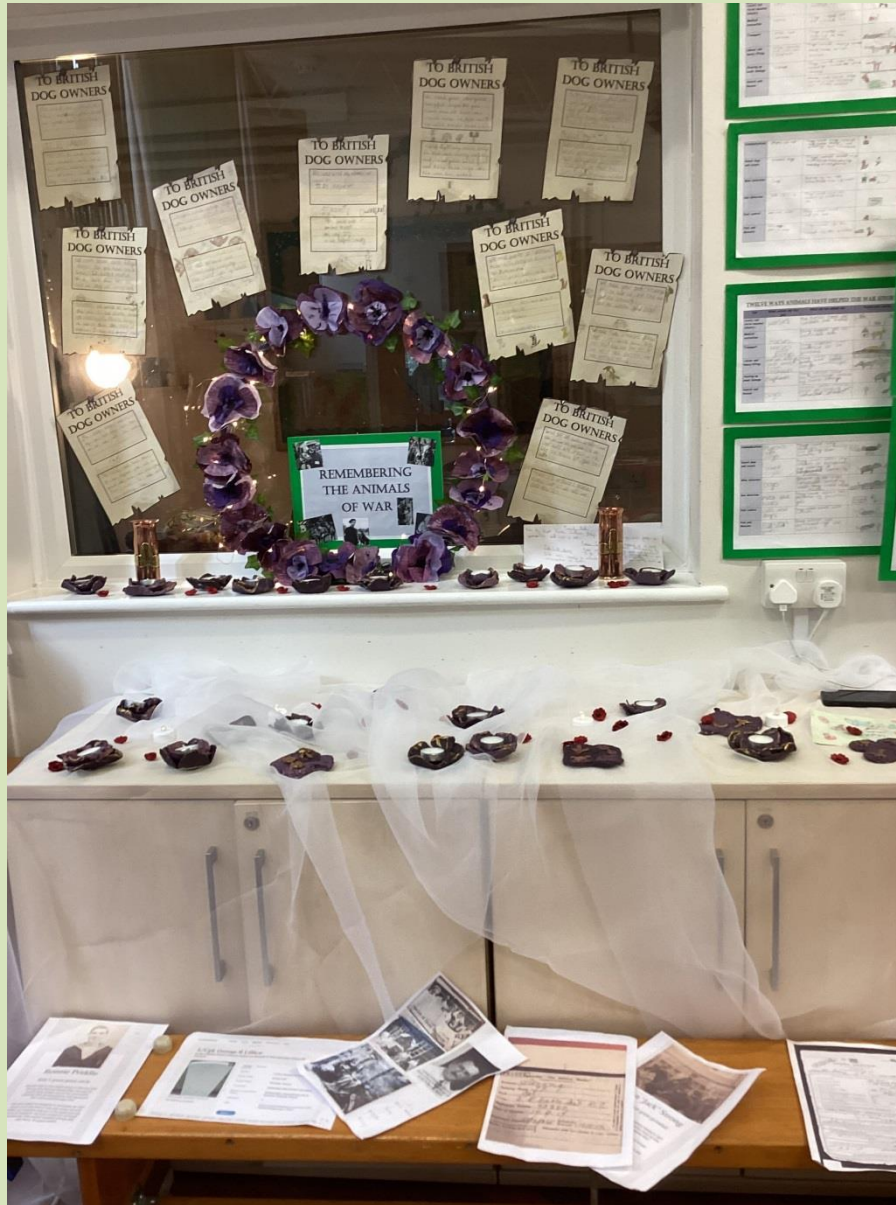
During World War 1 and World War 2, over 20,000 dogs were sent to help with the war effort. Many of these dogs saved and protected people, but many also lost their own lives. We investigated why these dogs were chosen for these jobs instead of humans and asked ourselves what we thought about asking dogs to do jobs for us.

PDSA Dickin Medal

We looked at the medal Maria Dickin, an animal welfare campaigner, introduced to recognise outstanding acts of duty displayed by animals serving in the war. The children worked in groups to investigate an animal that had received this award. This activity was entirely child-led and they enjoyed gathering the facts about their chosen animal.

Clay poppies

The purple poppy is a symbol of remembrance in the United Kingdom for animals that served during wartime. The children made tea-light poppies out of clay and then decorated them in different shades of purple to represent all the animals that we will be remembering.

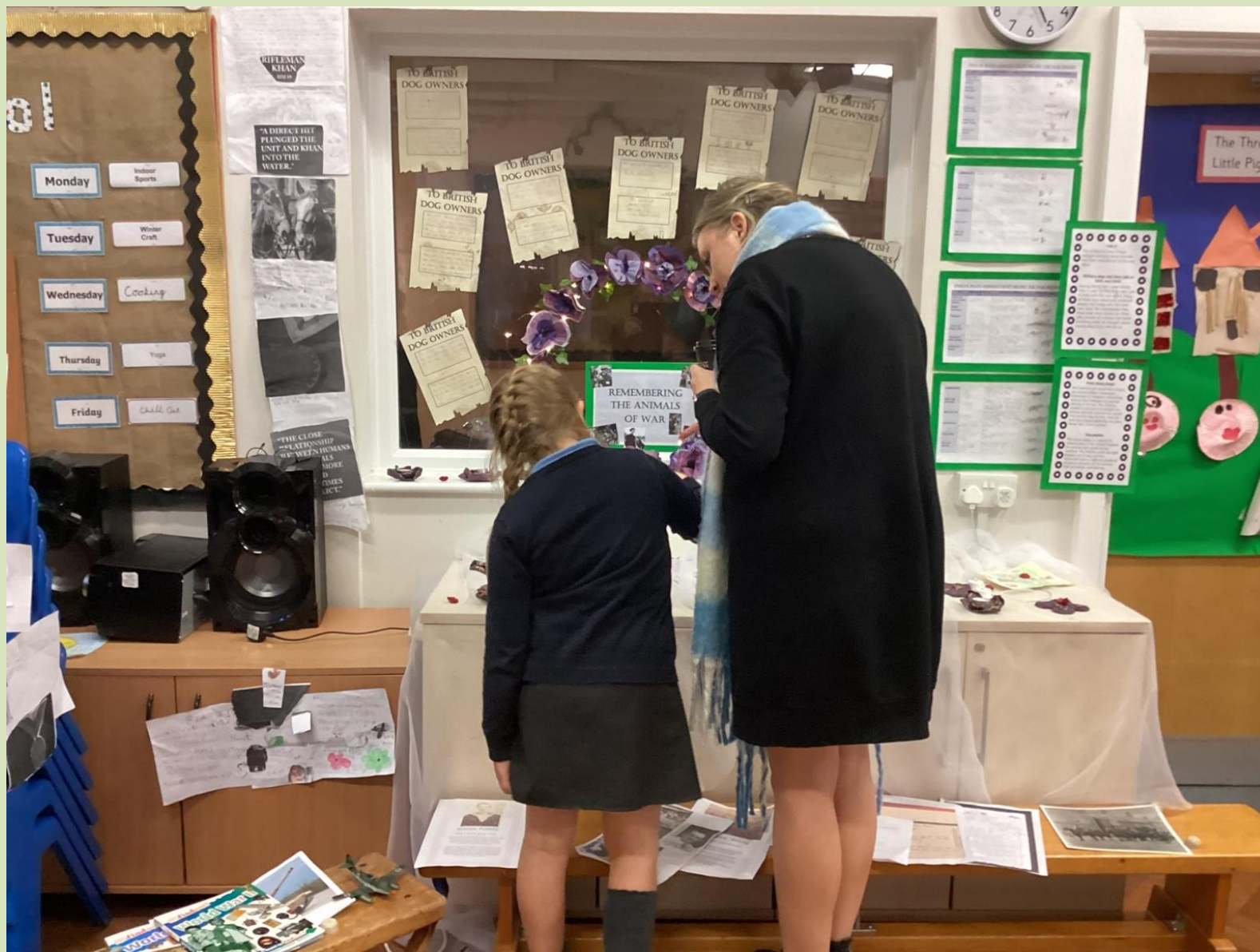

Pets and Mascots	Cats and dogs	They would lift the morale of the soldiers.	

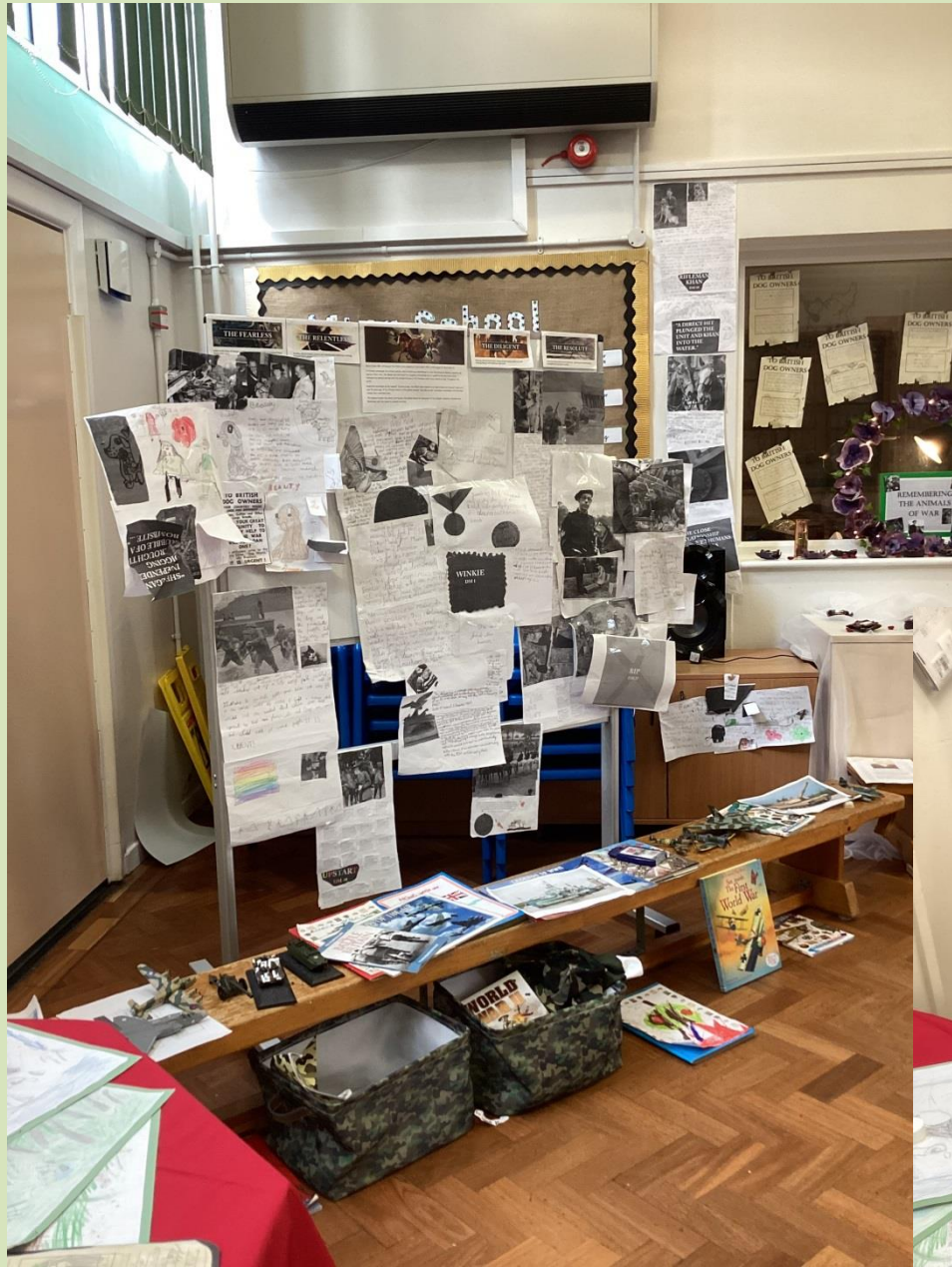
